
Why Movement Control Order (MCO)?

It could become a lot worse



Scenario 1


MCO is NOT adhered to 100%.

Transmission in the community continues. Hospitals will be full and some people will not get treatment — if you counted the dots from the top half you'll notice some are missing from the bottom half. They died.




The MCO is meant to prevent contact between • and • ...
