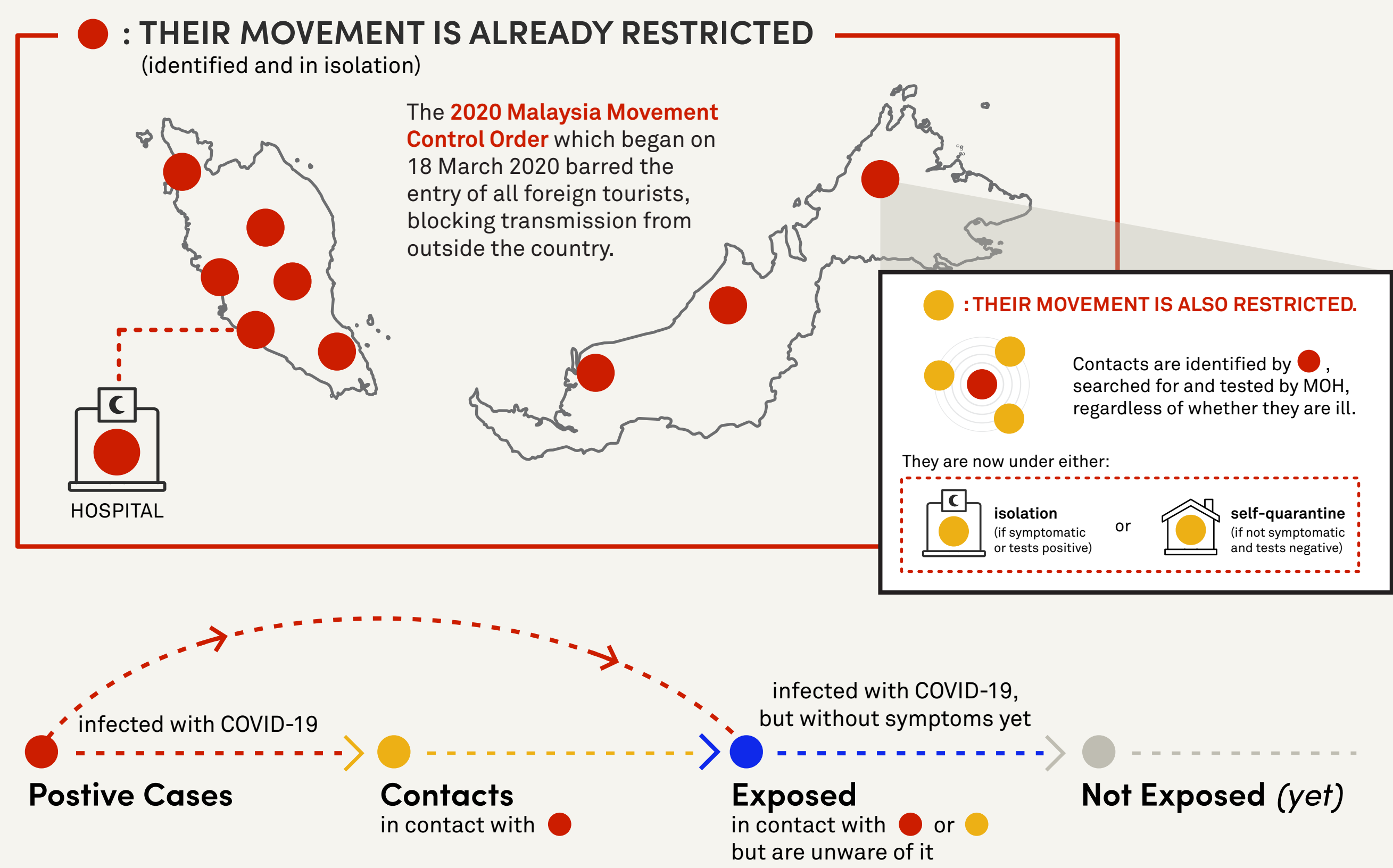


# Why Movement Control Order (MCO)?

There are now over **1500 positive cases** (= ●) of COVID-19 in Malaysia. [as of 23 March 2020]



## It could become a lot worse

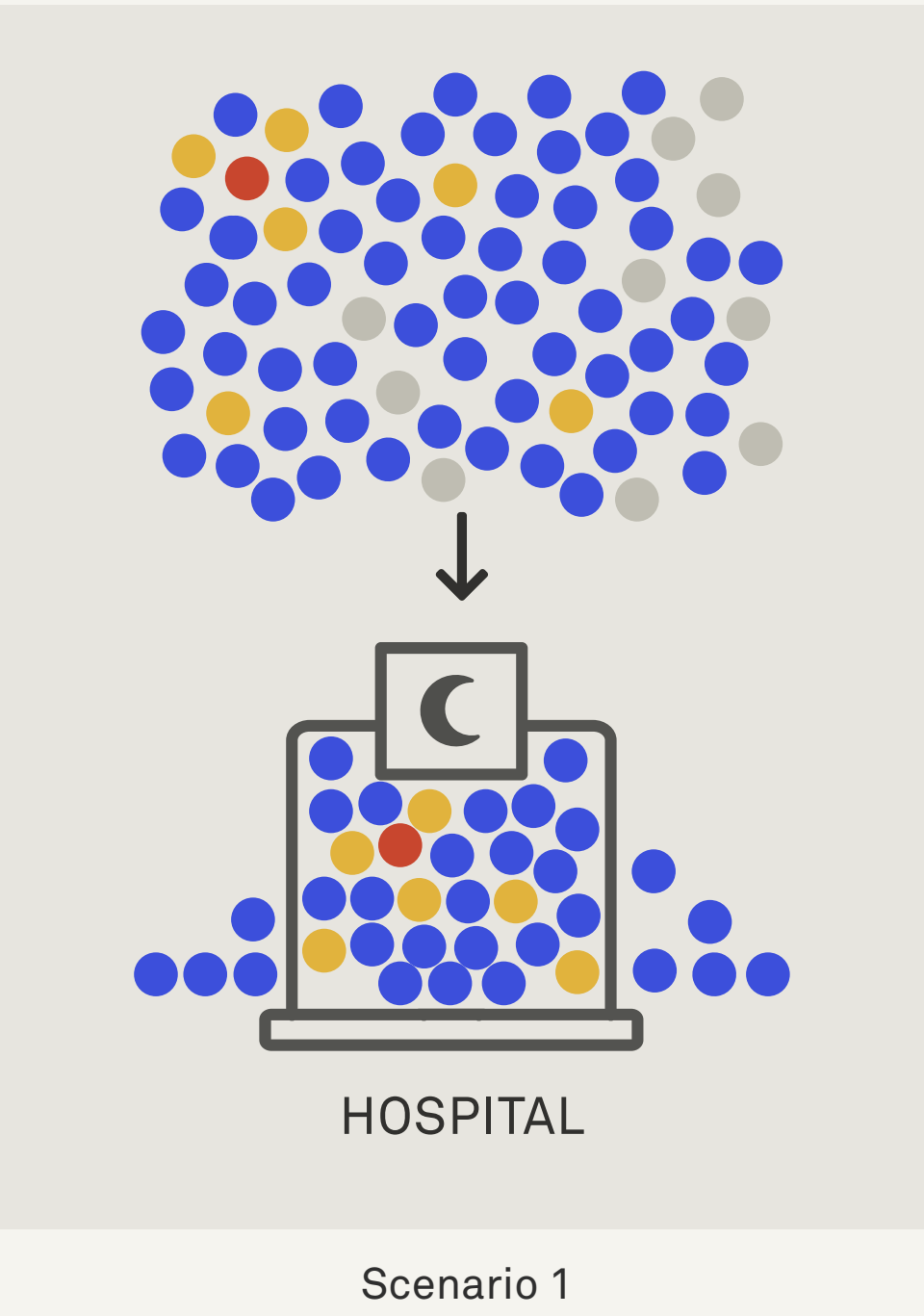
● are those who may have come in contact with ● or ● (if positive) before they were tested and isolated/quarantined. ● are unaware that they have been exposed to the virus, but may develop symptoms within 5-14 days. They can still transmit the virus to others even with no (or mild) symptoms.

● = not yet exposed to the virus.

Scenario 1

**MCO is NOT adhered to 100%.**

Transmission in the community continues. Hospitals will be full and some people will not get treatment — if you counted the dots from the top half you'll notice some are missing from the bottom half. They died.

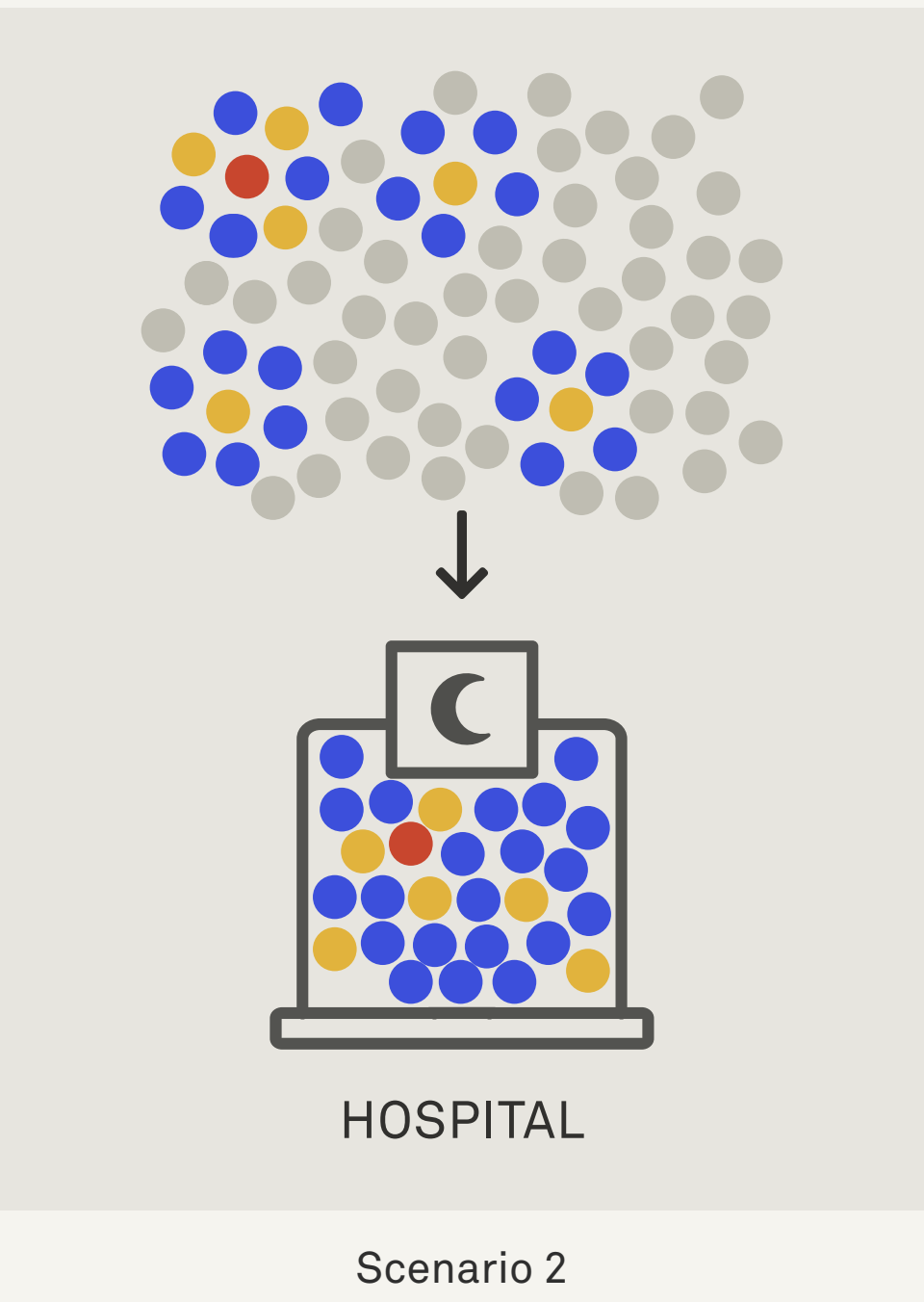
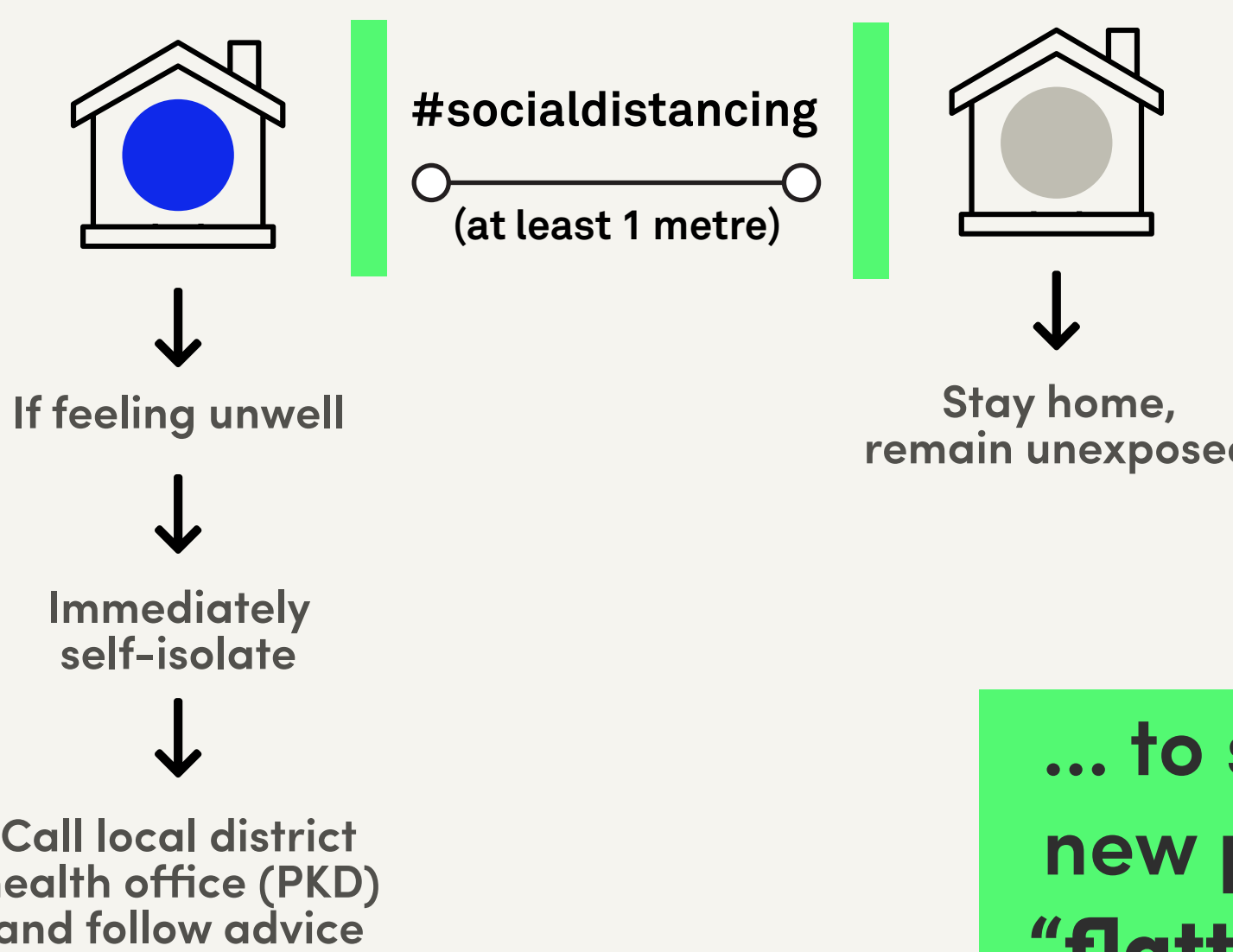


## The MCO is meant to prevent contact between ● and ● ...

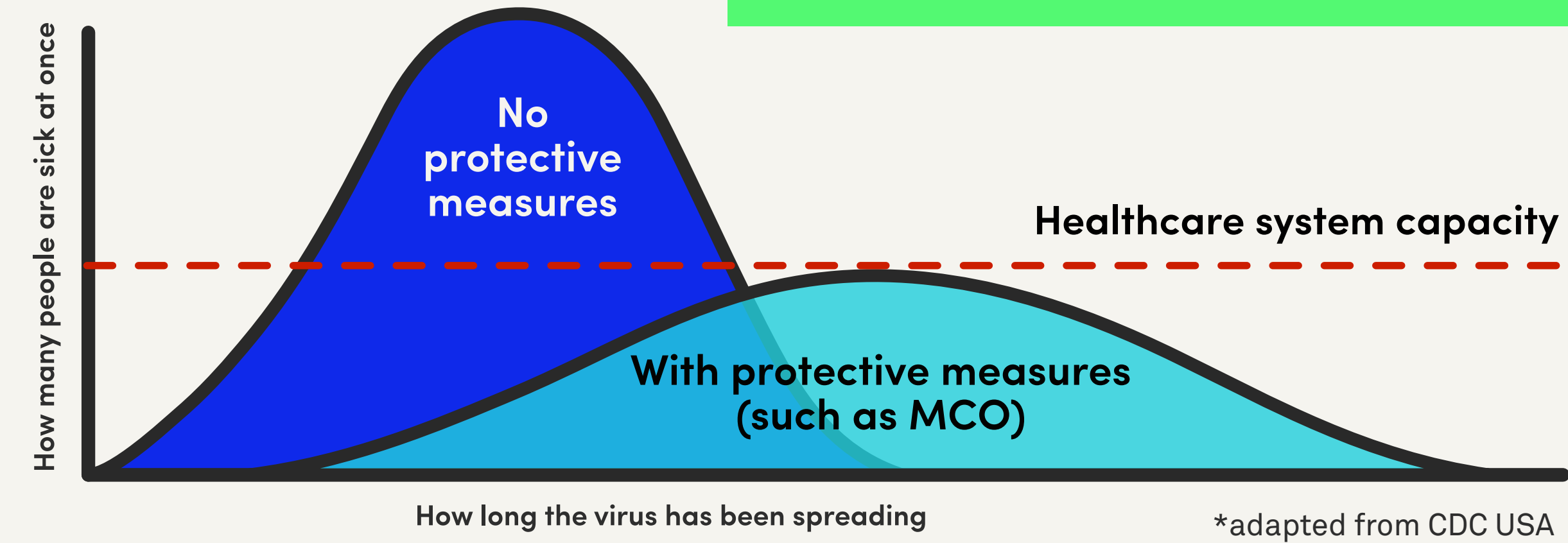
Scenario 2

**MCO is adhered to 100%.**

Hospitals are stretched, but can still cope with the number of ill people at any one time.
